PAC December 5, 2020 Dry Bean Drive Update

Dear PAC family members:

This update is for those of you who have been involved with PAC's Dry Bean Drive in the past and/or who think you might be interested in getting involved this year. If you are unfamiliar with what PAC's Dry Bean Drive is all about, I would encourage you to read the second last report in PAC's recent 84th Annual Report, dated November 22, 2020. If you don't already have the Annual Report, you could likely find it in PAC's library.

To probably no one's surprise, this year's bean drive has been affected by COVID-19, just like just about everything and everyone else in the world. However, while it has necessitated some fairly drastic changes to how we propose to do things for this year's drive, one thing that COVID-19 has not postponed or cancelled is the need for food experienced by many Manitobans on a daily basis. In fact, as people lost their jobs and incomes on account of COVID, and donations of food and money to foodbanks started to dry up for the same reason, the need for food assistance from foodbanks in Manitoba simultaneously increased dramatically. Since COVID-19 arrived in Manitoba in the spring of this year, demand for food at food banks has risen by at least 30%, and Harvest Manitoba (until very recently known as Winnipeg Harvest) currently indicates on their website (www.harvestmanitoba.ca) that they are now feeding 85,000 Manitobans every month.

Q1: So, what exactly is changing in relation to our dry bean drive this year? A1: Well, pretty much everything. We obviously knew beforehand that we wouldn't be able to hold the in-person fund drives on Sundays on account of the fact that we are not currently meeting together physically. What really surprised us though, was that when we checked with Harvest Manitoba to ensure that they would still be taking our donated dry peas or beans, they told us, regretfully, that they could not accept a bulk donation this year. They explained that COVID-19 restrictions had forced them to switch to a smaller, inhouse, pre-packaged model of supplying food to the foodbanks they work with and that, with a now also smaller staff complement (again thanks to COVID), they could not handle the bulk dry bean donation we were planning to provide them with. As a result, there is no point this year in us purchasing dry beans or peas in bulk for donation to Harvest Manitoba, because they are not currently in a position to make use of such a bulk donation. So effectively, there will be no 'dry bean drive' at PAC this year. That said, this does not mean that the need to continue to help provide food to hungry Manitobans does not continue to exist.

Q2: OK. So what's the proposed plan for this year? A2: The plan is this: We will collect donations at PAC over the remaining weeks of December 2020 (until December 31, 2020) for the purchase of food. However, instead of actually purchasing food items and donating them, we will instead donate the money that we have raised to Harvest Manitoba and allow them to use it for the purchase of food as they see fit.

Q3: That's a great idea, but how are we going to raise these donations since, as you said, we're not meeting in-person these days? A3: Anyone who is interested in making a donation to this food drive can do so in the same way that they would make a donation to the church's budget or any of its ministries. There are a number of ways that this can currently be done, including mailing a cheque to PAC or dropping it off in the church's mailbox located at the church's side entrance. Alternatively, donations can also be made electronically via e-transfer to payments@pachurch.ca; the instructions for doing so are outlined on PAC's website at pachurch.ca under the heading 'Giving'. Regardless of whether you donate using a physical method (like a cheque) or electronically, it is of paramount importance that you designate your donation towards 'Harvest Manitoba', so that Melanie Penner, PAC's Director of Administration, will know that the donation is intended for inclusion in PAC's food drive.

Q4: Sounds like 'a plan'. Is there anything else we need to know? A4: Actually, yes. As was always the case during our dry bean drives, and continues to be the case now, we want you, the donor, to ensure that whatever you choose to give toward this food drive is 'over-and-above' your financial commitments to PAC's current budget and ministries. In no way do we want our donations to this food drive to become a case of 'robbing Peter to pay Paul'.

Q5: Fair enough. Does this mean that our days of raising donations and then actually buying and donating dry beans or peas are over? A5: I can only give you my personal opinion on that. I don't really think so, or at least, I hope not. From my perspective, this new plan is currently in place only as long as the current COVID restrictions require it. I think, over the long haul, the idea of PAC raising money and buying food ingredients in bulk still makes sense, both from a nutritional and economics standpoint. Additionally, as donors, I think that actually buying something physical that we donate provides us with a psychological incentive to give more, as opposed to simply donating money towards something. But as I already said, that's just my opinion. Time will tell...

MISSION UPDATE - Randy Friesen (Multiply)

I received an update last week from one of our leaders in North Africa requesting prayer for a new Christ follower who was preparing for baptism. Last week, while he was walking home from a house church meeting, he was beaten up and robbed. His wallet (including national identity card) and phone were stolen. When he reported this assault and theft to local police, he was detained and interrogated about his faith in Christ and his connection to the local house church. They threatened him, assaulted him, and held him over night. The next day, he was interrogated again and asked to sign a statement accusing the church leader of converting him. He refused. He was then pressured to inform the police about others in his house church. Again he refused. Finally, he was threatened and released. Throughout the ordeal, the young man remained quiet and clear in his testimony to Christ.

The next day, he met with the leader of the house church and told him about his experience. When the leader asked whether he still wanted to receive baptism, the young man replied, "Yes, I am ready to die with Christ."

Let's pray for this young man. In his baptism, he has both died with Christ and been raised to new life through the resurrection power of the Spirit. As we consider the burden and limitations that we face during this pandemic, let's invite Christ to take us deeper into the reality of our death and resurrection with Christ. As we do, we will experience joy, freedom and boldness to live on mission regardless of the cost. That's good news this Christmas as we retell the story of God's incarnation in Bethlehem despite threats, violence and surveillance. Good news is sometimes costly to experience and share!

Thank you for praying for our staff team and new board in this season. We look forward to the good things the Lord has ahead of us in mission together.
